- Possess a 4 year bachelor degree
- . Have at least a 70% GPA on the last 60 credits of your degree
- Serious interest in making a positive difference in the north
- Preference for students who reside and are employed in Northern Saskatchewan
- \* Eligible students receive a scholarship of \$1000/month for up to 16
